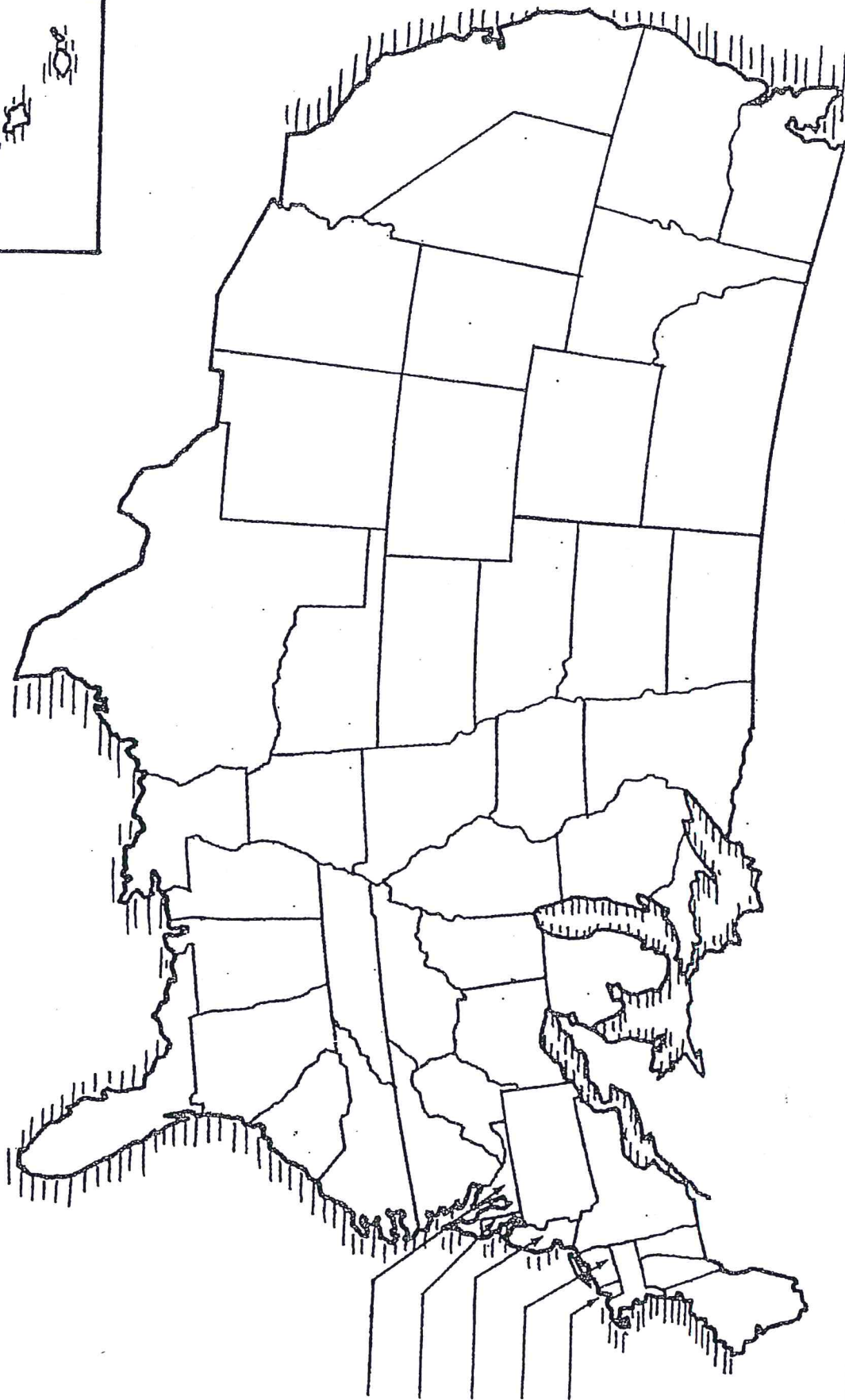
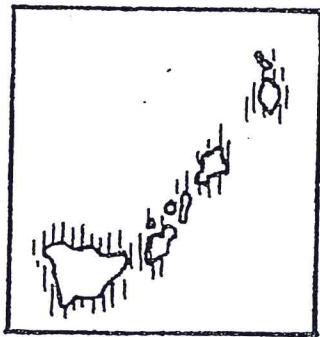

Time plays no favorites and will pass whether you act or not



























